## **NOTA INFORMATIVA Nº 75/2013**

### **THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT HAS GRANTED LEAVE TO THE RELIEF APPEAL FILED BY THE GOVERNMENT AGAINST THE LAW PREVENTING EVICTIONS IN NAVARRA**

The Plenary Session of the Constitutional Court has granted leave to an unconstitutionality appeal filed by the Government against the Regional Law 24/2013, July 2, on Urgent Measures to guarantee the right of access to a home in the Region of Navarra, popularly known as the "*anti-eviction act*".

The leave granted for this relief appeal entails the automatic and cautionary suspension of the contested statute because the Government has invoked article 161.2 of the Constitution ("*The Government may challenge before the Constitutional Court any provisions and resolutions adopted by the bodies of the Autonomous Communities. The challenge entails the suspension of the appealed provision or resolution, but the Constitutional Court must ratify or lift such suspension within the term of five months*").

The Plenary Meeting has agreed to notify the Congress, the Senate and the Government of this appeal and these institutions have fifteen days in order to become party to these proceedings and lodge any pleadings.

The leave to proceed order issued by the Court does not entail any judgment on the merits of the case which shall be examined by the Court in the near future.
