## **PRESS RELEASE No. 58/2019**

### **THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT WILL EXAMINE THE QUESTION OF UNCONSTITUTIONALITY RAISED BY THE HIGH COURT OF THE BALEARIC ISLANDS CONCERNING THE REGIONAL LAW ON INTERIM LOCAL POLICE MEMBERS**

The Plenary Session of the Constitutional Court has granted leave to proceed to the question of unconstitutionality (*"cuestión de inconstitucionalidad"*) raised by the First Section of the Administrative Chamber of the High Court of Justice (*"Tribunal Superior de Justicia"*) of the Balearic Islands against the second transitory provision of the Decree-Law of the Balearic Government 1/2017, dated 13 January, amending Law 20/2006 (15 December) on Municipal and Local Regulations of the Balearic Islands, and Law 3/2007 (27 March) on the Public Administration of the Autonomous Community of the Balearic Islands and on measures relating to the coordination of local police forces in the Balearic Islands. In addition, the question of unconstitutionality also concerned article 41 of the Law 4/2013, of the Parliament of the Balearic Islands (17 July), on the coordination of local police forces.

The Court has resolved to notify the content of the judicial proceedings to the Congress of Deputies, to the Senate, to the Government and to the General State Prosecutor and to the executive and parliamentary organs of this Autonomous Community, so that they may join the proceedings as parties and submit the arguments they deem appropriate.

Likewise, the Court has notified to the First Section of the Administrative Chamber of the Regional High Court the suspension of the corresponding judicial proceedings until the Constitutional Court renders a definitive judgement on the matter.
