THE PLENARY OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT WILL EXAMINE THE APPEAL OF UNCONSTITUTIONALITY FILED BY MORE THAN 50 MPs OF THE *PARTIDO POPULAR*, *VOX* AND *CIUDADANOS* PARTIES AGAINST THE NAVARRESE LAW ON THE REPARATION OF VICTIMS OF FAR RIGHT GROUPS ATTACKS

The Plenary Session of the Constitutional Court has granted leave to proceed to the appeal of unconstitutionality filed by more than 50 MPs of the parliamentary groups of *Partido Popular*, *Vox* and *Ciudadanos* against Navarrese Law 16/2019, dated March 26th, on the recognition and reparation of the victims who suffered politically-inspired attacks committed by far right groups or public employees.

The Court has ordered to notify the appeal and all related documents to the Congress of Deputies, to the Senate, as well as to the Parliament and the Government of Navarre, so that they may join the proceedings as parties and make the submissions they deem appropriate.

The plaintiffs contend that the challenged law violates the constitutional clause that reserves the exercise of jurisdiction to the members of the judiciary, as provided under article 117.3 of the Constitution, as well as articles 53.2, 18 and 24, concerning the rights of third persons affected by the procedure regulated under the challenged Navarrese law.
